Autism Assessments

Autism is a neurodiversity and may impact how a person thinks, feels, interacts with others and experiences their environment. Individuals with Autism may have sensitivities to sensory stimuli, have specific interests and may engage in repetitive patterns of behaviours.

ADHD Assessments

Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is a neurodiversity and may impact how a person thinks, feels, interacts with others and experience their environment.

Individuals with the inattentive component have difficulty with remaining organised, maintaining concentration and may be easily distracted. Individuals with the hyperactive/impulsive component may have trouble sitting still, waiting their turn, and often need to fidget or talk.



Academic & Learning Assessments

A comprehensive learning assessment explores an individual's current academic performance in the areas of maths, reading, writing, spelling, listening, and oral language. The assessment provides a summary of the individual's strengths and weaknesses. Results indicate whether an individual has learning difficulties and whether they meet criteria for a diagnosis of a Specific Learning Disorder (SLD) such as dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia.

Cognitive & Developmental Assessments

A Cognitive assessment involves a comprehensive exploration of an individual's cognitive abilities, for example their ability to reason, their working memory, and their processing speed. The assessment provides a summary of the individual's strengths and weaknesses which can be used to help support them at school, work, and university and aid in the identification of intellectual disability, giftedness, school readiness and other learning and developmental challenges.

The aim of an assessment is to determine whether the individual meets the criteria in order to provide further opportunity for guidance and access to different support services.

EARLY INTERVENTION

We believe early intervention provides the best chance for a child to receive essential supports for them to thrive throughout their life. This can also help to provide resources and support for family and improve relationships, behaviour and promote future fulfilment.

OUR PROCESS

Initial Patient Consultation

All patients will have an initial patient consult (50 minutes).

This will either be for the adult or for the parents of the child who is having the assessment. This consult enables your therapist to specifically tailor the assessment for the individual.

Assessment Consultation/s

After the initial patient consultation we will contact you with the details of your assessment, full fee and appointments to be made.

The duration and number of appointments depend on the assessment type. This fee includes all testing appointments and report writing.

Feedback Consultation

A comprehensive assessment report is given to the patient in this feedback consultation (50 minutes).

This will either be for the adult or parents of the child who had the assessment. This is an opportunity to review the report and for your therapist to provide guidance and recommendations.
